One winter day in the early 1800s, New York City's Fire Company Number 11 is in trouble. A deadly snowstorm is blowing, and many of the volunteers are sick in bed. When the fire alarm sounds, who will answer the call? Who will save the neighborhood? Molly Williams, the company's cook, for one!

Clapping a weathered leather helmet on her head, strapping spatterdashes over her woolen leggings, and pulling on heavy work gloves—it's Molly, by golly, to the rescue.

Young readers will enjoy this spirited re-telling of a unique heroine and her thrilling adventure drawn from firefighting lore, while learning how fires were fought in early America. Author Dianne Ochiltree and artist Kathleen Kemly worked closely with firefighting experts and relied on historic records and pictures to capture the heroic legend of Molly Williams—the first known female firefighter in America.

MOLLY, BY GOLLY! provides several helpful resources such as firefighting websites and links, a select bibliography, Frequently Asked Questions, other books about firefighting, and information on finding fire museum locations across the U.S.

Dianne Ochiltree has been writing poems and stories since she was a kid growing up in a small Midwestern town. Dianne is the author of several acclaimed picture books for the very young, including *Ten Monkey Jamboree*; *Sixteen Runaway Pumpkins*; and *Lull-a-bye, Little One*.
